APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

The application process involves steps designed to help us get to know each other better. Components of the process include TOEFL, TOEFL Junior, IELTS or Duolingo exams, admission application, student interview, recommendations, transcripts or academic summary, standardized test scores, and a copy of the

SERVICES PROVIDED

The following services are included for all international students and are provided through the international student program fee. These benefits, often extremely limited or non-existent in other international programs and independent schools, are proudly offered at MPA:

- **ADVANCED LANGUAGE AND CULTURE COURSE: This** course has a 6:1 student-to-teacher ratio for all international students and is built into the curriculum as a World Language credit towards graduation. First-year international students are enrolled in this course to help with the cultural transition to an American high school, to discuss important social and historical events of the United States, and learn the nuances of strong academic English and vocabulary to achieve fluency.
- **COLLEGE APPLICATION SUPPORT:** MPA's full-time college counseling staff provide guidance and direction every step of the way as international students find their best fit. This includes assistance with the application process, writing the college essay, and navigating the process.
- **DEDICATED INTERNATIONAL STUDENT PROGRAM DIRECTOR:** The International Student Program director serves as an advisor, teacher, and confidant to all international students on a daily basis and regularly monitors their academic achievement. Given MPA's emphasis on public speaking, college preparatory writing, and higher Lexile level reading, students work one-on-one or in small groups with the program director throughout the entire duration of their MPA experience.
- HOST FAMILY SELECTION, ACCLIMATION AND SUPPORT: Host families are carefully recruited, selected and vetted to ensure the highest quality experience for our students. The program director works closely with students and their host families to ensure that the home is a safe, welcoming, happy environment for all. Regular (at least three times per year) home visits, one-on-one check-ins with students and host families, communication with natural parents, and student/ family events are all ways that the pprogram director works with host families and students to build routine. communication, and a supportive experience.
- **NEW INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ORIENTATION:** Orientation includes one-on-one meetings with the division leadership to create a class schedule, acclimation to classroom and school culture, laptop orientation, plagiarism discussion, school supply shopping, sight-seeing in the Twin Cities, student networking opportunities, and more.
- PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OF FACULTY: Faculty professional development provides knowledge and skills to

- support the needs of international students and to deepen their understanding of working with students from varying cultures. The program director often also plays a role in communication between students, teachers, host parents and natural parents, ensuring the success of our students.
- **STUDENT TRANSITION SUPPORT:** Transition and language support is offered throughout the student's time at MPA and in preparation for postsecondary schooling. The program director is available for ongoing academic support, especially in the areas of History and English, essay writing and high-level reading comprehension, and assisting students in their understanding of American educational standards. There is also summer orientation and quarterly events throughout the year to help support new and returning students. Visa and immigration assistance and documentation support is also provided. All international students have the program director available to help them navigate homesickness, friendships. social situations and events, stress, and culture shock. When needed, the program director works closely with the school counselor and division leadership to be sure the student is as happy and healthy as possible during their time at MPA.
